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Figure Labels:  
 Use 8 point Times New Roman for Figure labels. Use words rather than symbols or abbreviations when writing Figure axis labels to avoid

confusing the reader. As an example, write the quantity "Magnetization", or "Magnetization, M", not just "M". If including units in the label, present the m within parentheses. Do not label axes only with units. In the example, write "Magnetization (A/m)" or "Magnetization {A[m(1)]}", not just "A/m". Do not label axes with a ratio of quantities and units. For example, write "Temperature (K)", not "Temperature/K".

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Give all authors' last names in all-capitals. Unless there are six authors or more list all the authors; do not use "et.al.". Papers that have not been published, even if they have been submitted for publication, should be cited as "unpublished" [4]. Papers that have been accepted for publications should be cited as "in press" [5: 135]. Capitalize only the first word in a paper title, except for proper nouns and element symbols. If the publication is a book, give the book title in italics, and if it is a paper in a periodical, give the periodical name in italics, too, leaving the paper title in regular.
